Walk Safely to School Day 2025

On Friday, May 16, St Joseph's students eagerly took part in Walk Safely to School Day, an event that promotes road safety and encourages students to embrace the many benefits of walking to school.

Over 20 learners gathered bright and early at Ramblers Oval by 8:10am, braving the brisk morning air with enthusiasm and smiles. They were warmly welcomed by our organiser Cooper Skinner, along with Lisa Watkins, Claire Paice, Val Scott, Simon Harris, Evan Wrobel, and Jo Gibbon. It was heartening to see so many of our learners starting the day in such a positive and active way.

National Walk Safely to School Day (WSTSD) is an annual event designed to teach and reinforce safe pedestrian behaviour in young students, while also encouraging healthy habits, environmental awareness, and the use of public transport. The initiative's core goals include:

- Encouraging parents and caregivers to walk with their children and model safe pedestrian practices.
- Highlighting the health benefits of walking and establishing regular walking routines.
- Reinforcing the importance of children under 10 holding an adult's hand when crossing the road and learning essential road safety skills.

Walking to school offers more than just health benefits—it also helps reduce traffic congestion and air pollution, while fostering a stronger sense of community. Events like WSTSD play a vital role in shaping safe, healthy, and environmentally conscious behaviours that children can carry into adulthood.

Confirmation



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Excursion to Paracombe Premium Perry - Year 6

On Wednesday 7th of May, 6A travelled to Paracombe for an exciting excursion to Paracombe Premium Perry. An engaging horticultural experience was provided to students by this 100% South Australian-owned business. Located in the scenic hills of Paracombe, students explored the journey of the pear – from tree to bottle.

Upon arrival, students were welcomed by the farm's owner, Damian, who is a 4th generation pear grower. As part of the excursion, students were provided with a tour of the shed facilities, where they had the opportunity to see first-hand how technology plays an important role in the pear industry. A supporting presentation was provided to the students which further outlined these processes. Of course, no visit would be complete without a tasting of the 100% fresh, South Australian juice. With a variety of flavours to try, students were excited to be able to enjoy a tasting of each. Students completed the excursion with a walk through the orchard trees amongst the sheep which the farm utilises to manage weeds naturally.

This excursion supported Year 6 Agriculture lessons and an alignment to the food & fibre curriculum. It was a fantastic opportunity for students to see first-hand how pears are grown, and the different processes pears go through prior to being sold. Students will now reflect upon these processes in the classroom.
