From the Principal



Dear Parents, Carers, Teachers, and Students,

Welcome to Week 9 - Final Newsletter for Semester 1, 2025.

Please note that Term 3 begins on Tuesday, 22nd July, as Monday, 21st July, is a staff professional learning day.

This informal gathering is a lovely opportunity for new students to meet their classmates and teachers, and to become familiar with their new learning environment before officially starting school the following day.
